Applicants for the Woodford County All-Star Award must demonstrate excellence in a well-rounded approach to 4-H participation. In order to be named a 4-H All Star you must earn 8 points, with at least 5 points in projects, 1 point in leadership and 1 point in communication. You may earn 1 point for each level (county, district, state) you participate in. For example, someone who shows a livestock project animal at a county show, a district show and the state fair would earn 3 points while someone who participates at the State Skillathon Contest would earn just 1 point.

Participants may also earn up to 3 points for their participation in the 4-H Youth Expo, earning 1 point for each project (up to 3) they submit. They may also earn up to 2 points by submitting an application to the State 4-H Achievement Program, which can be used as points in the Project category.

Participants earning 8-10 points will earn either \$25 to be used on the 4-H mall or \$25 towards a 4-H activity. Participants earning 11+ points will earn \$50 on the 4-H Mall or \$50 towards a 4-H activity. Also, dependent on sponsorship, the top overall point scorer will receive a prize. All ties will be broken by participant State 4-H Achievement Application score.
